ollowing the RI Convention in Brisbane, Fran and I remained in Queensland for the first meeting of the 2003-2004 Board of Directors was scheduled to meet immediately after the convention.

On Thursday evening following the convention, we were advised that President Elect Jonathan was required to leave for London, England because of Ade's condition. He successfully convened the first day of meetings with his board. It was a full day and none of us were aware



of the seriousness of the situation.

President Elect Jon had arrived in England, to be at her side during the afternoon of June 6th. On Saturday, June 7th, we were advised that Ade had passed away. Ade was in hospital in England recovering from a stroke.

Naturally, this shocking news has deeply affected those of us who had come to know her and of her warm affection, enthusiasm and support for
